Best Practices

Avoid inline CSS

```
<p style="color: #ffffff; font-family: arial;  
margin: 0 10px 10px 10px;"> Blah </p>
```

Use external stylesheets

```
<head>  
  <style>  
    ...  
  </style>  
</head>
```

vs.

```
<link href="style.css" rel="stylesheet" type="text/css">
```

Use a browser reset

```
body {  
  margin: 0;  
  padding: 0;  
}
```

```
div {  
  margin: 0;  
  padding: 0;  
}
```

```
img {  
  margin: 0;  
  padding: 0;  
}
```

Use CSS Shorthand

```
margin-left:2px;  
margin-top:3px;  
margin-right:4px;  
margin-bottom:5px;
```

vs.

```
margin: 3px 4px 5px 2px;
```

Best Practices

- Name classes and IDs based on function not appearance
- Organize your CSS file
- Make your code easy to read
- Document your code
- Do not over-use containers
- Keep a library of helpful CSS classes
- Use CSS Frameworks
